Current UK Risk Level: HIGH

The risk to the UK has been raised to high (as of 13/03/2020).

As of 13 Mar, UK is in the 'delay' phase of the government's action plan to limit the spread of the virus.

Current Situation

UK

 As of 9am on 24 March 2020, a total of 90,436 people have been tested, of which 82,359 were confirmed negative and 8,077 were confirmed positive. 422 patients in the UK who tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) have died.

- In Suffolk we have 28 confirmed cases. However, with routine community testing discontinued, these figures will not describe the full extent of cases locally. You can view the latest UK Dashboard of cases and deaths here.
- <u>Coronavirus: SMS messages</u> The government is texting people across the UK to inform them of the new stay at home rules announced by the Prime Minister on 23 March 2020. This has been made possible thanks to the cooperation of mobile phone operators. The SMS message reads:
- Coronavirus (COVID-19): Foreign Secretary's statement on support for British people abroad
- Briefing paper on the Coronavirus Bill: health and social care measures
 - Section 2 covers the Bill's health and social care workforce measures, including provisions on emergency registration, indemnity cover, emergency volunteers and NHS pensions
 - Section 3 covers measures to reduce administrative requirements on health and social care staff.
 - Section 4 covers changes to mental health and mental capacity legislation
 - Section 5 covers other public health measures
- Gov.uk Companies to receive 3-month extension period to file accounts during COVID-19
- Gov.uk Government confirms £500 million hardship fund will provide council tax relief for vulnerable households

SUFFOLK:

- Launch of new volunteering app and phoneline: A new Suffolkfocused community service has been set up to support people who need help during the COVID-19 pandemic. Called 'Home But Not Alone', the service has been
 - launched to help connect people who want to volunteer in their communities with neighbours who are most in need.
 - The service will mean willing volunteers, charities, town and parish councils, community and religious groups can all log their details and offers of support on an app, while people who need help can phone to request support. As the number of offers and requests grows, they will be matched so that the right help can be given where it's most needed.
 - The free app, called **Tribe Volunteer**, can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. The telephone number for those in genuine need of help is freephone **0800 876 6926** and will be staffed from 09:00 to 17:00, seven days a week.
- Children's Centres All Children's Centres are now closed for open access and group work. Child Health Clinics are running by appointment only from some centres and accommodating partners such as Midwives, Physios and Speech and Language Therapists to run their clinics from other centres. - Suffolk County Council buildings: All SCC buildings are now closed to the public
 until further notice. If you need to contact SCC urgently please call 0345 606 6067 or

- Road Safety Campaign: Suffolk Roadsafe is supporting Road Safety GB and
 encouraging all road users to do their bit to reduce the strain on the emergency
 services in the coming weeks and months, by taking extra care every time they
 travel. The pressure being placed on the NHS by the escalating situation with regard
 to coronavirus is well known and the situation is likely to get much worse in the
 coming weeks and months.
- New timetables are now in place for most public transport services including
 buses, trains and community transport until further notice. SCC is doing all it can to
 help keep vital services going for those people who must travel our key workers
 and elderly and vulnerable residents. These changes will also help ensure there are
 enough members of staff to keep vital services running over the coming weeks and
 months. SCC will continue to monitor the situation with partners.
- Ipswich Park and Ride: Due to the ongoing Coronavirus outbreak, and in line with the government's advice regarding non-essential travel, Ipswich Park and Ride (service 800) will be suspended until further notice from today <Wednesday 25th March>
